# **Maths**

In KS1, Year 1 Blue had a blast with an interactive whack-amole game! Using balloons to show the correct answers, we turned this online game into a hands-on activity that reinforced the students' knowledge of doubles up to 20. The children loved the excitement as they worked on speed and accuracy to pop the right balloon. It was a fun and engaging way to practice their math skills while keeping the energy high!

In KS2, Year 3 had a productive Maths lesson reviewing weight and volume measurement! The students practiced comparing and estimating different weights, as well as measuring volumes using standard units. They worked on solving practical problems to apply their knowledge, showcasing great focus and enthusiasm. Well done, Year 3, for your hard work and determination in mastering these important skills.











In KS1, Year 1 Yellow had an exciting Science lesson exploring how objects move! Working in small groups, the children began with a simple activity, moving a ball in different ways to observe its motion. They then tested their predictions by gently rolling a ball to the finish line and experimenting with what would happen if they pushed the ball harder. It was amazing to see their curiosity and teamwork as they discovered how force affects movement.

In KS2, Year 4 began their new Science unit on states of matter! The students learned about the differences between solids, liquids, and gases, and worked on classifying various classroom materials into these states. They then made predictions and explored the unique properties of liquids through hands-on activities. It was a fantastic start to the unit, sparking curiosity and critical thinking.

# **Chinese Language**



EYFS Job Term 3 has begun anew! After a brief review of the main learning contents from last term, our lovely students learned about the names

KS1 Over the past two weeks, students have been reviewing content from the previou two terms. In addition to the review, they have also started on a new lesson. Year 1 students, for example, have begun learning about colors, recognizing these characters, and using these words in sentences. The year 2 students started to learn about different types of furniture. Year 2 students also learned that complex characters/words are a combination of simple characters.

KS2 This week, students began to learn about the weather. They learned how to say rain, snow and terminology used when talking about the weather. They also learned how to identify the characters for each of the words. To reinforce their learning, the children played whack-a-mole by repeating these words and trying to use these words in simple sentences to describe the weather.
